HOME BUILDERS COLLABORATE ON NEW SCHEME TO EMPOWER WOMEN INTO SITE MANAGEMENT

In January the Home Builders Federation (HBF) and Women Into Construction (WiC), launched a scheme to support women to become site managers. The programme was designed in partnership with nine major homebuilders to prepare candidates specifically for the role.

Delivered face-to-face and virtually, the programme's first cohort encouraged more than 80 women across the country to attend an information session, with 18 women accepted to complete the course's work placements, exposing them to invaluable industry knowledge and experience.

The second cohort was announced on 26th April and the team was delighted to see the programme shortlisted for 'Best career development initiative' in the Women in Housing Awards.

RAISING MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS IN PARLIAMENT

In February HBF and 40 industry representatives gathered at the Houses of Parliament to highlight the work developers are doing to increase mental health awareness amongst their workforces. The Mental Health Awareness Reception was sponsored by Dean Russell, Member of Parliament for Watford, and saw the release of a new report outlining the actions industry has taken so far to tackle the stigma associated with poor mental health.

Free Mental Health Awareness Training for SMEs and the supply chain

HBF has joined up with Lighthouse Club Construction Industry Charity to offer free mental health awareness training to SMEs and those working in the supply chain.

Participants will receive advice and guidance on how to look after their own mental health and what confidential support is available to them, their colleagues and their families.

The facilitators will also discuss what signs to look out for and how to start a conversation with someone who may be struggling.

FUNDING SECURED TO DELIVER POPULAR BRICKWORK MASTERCLASSES

Due to popular demand, free Brickwork Masterclasses will continue until September 2023. Funded by CITB, HBF launched the initiative with NHBC and the Association of Brickwork Contractors to address common issues. So far more than 9,000 bricklayers have been trained.

The 90-minute onsite sessions are designed to share practical insights and cover a range of subjects from fire stopping to bonding and lintels. All attendees take away a useful copy of the material covered on the day and relevant NHBC Standards Extracts.
