

# WOMEN INTO HOME BUILDING PROJECT CONTINUES ITS SUCCESS

HBF's Women into Homebuilding employment programme has recently completed its second cohort of the programme with 11 women now securing site management positions or similar roles within the construction sector.

The programme was launched with Women into Construction, in January 2023, with women from diverse backgrounds and different levels of experience coming together to learn and grow their skills. As part of the programme, women attend an insight session, introducing the industry, followed by a two-week work placement at a site-based location near to them.
